Dear Maureen,

I know that Chris is at the BOE today and you are handling questions with Alan.

Since I spoke with you earlier a question was posed to me that is worthy of posing to your office. I have been telling a number of people that as per the town board resolution that no one can vote in the election unless they registered through the county board of elections by last Tuesday 9/23.

Now I am being told that under town law that people can vote even if unregistered if they have been living in the town for 30 days prior to the election.

I reread Section 84 of the town law and it still seems to be consistent with the town resolution on this matter but in an abundance of caution I want to ask under FOIL and I ask to be responded to immediately (as time is of the essence) and electronically:

"If a resident shows up at a polling location and is not already registered by 9/23/2014 through the Rockland County Board of Elections, will they be allowed to vote?"

Please explain the instructions that were given to the poll watchers regarding handling this situation?
